



Dear IVE Meeting participants, welcome!

In this introduction we want to explain the goals of this first international meeting of the Religious Family of the Incarnate Word and the activities that we will do to reach them during these days.

1- Principle Goal: Public Profession of Faith to Our Lord Jesus Christ.

The principle goal is the profession. It is a profession with a single voice, of our convicted and ardent desire that Jesus Christ, man's Only Savior, be explicitly present in every aspect of human reality, since there is no other name under heaven given to the human race by which we can be saved. 10 As early as 1925, Pope Pius XI noted that the great «manifold evils in the world were due to the fact that the majority of men had thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law out of their lives; that these had no place either in private affairs or in politics.» 11 The Pope sternly declared that «as long as individuals and states refused to submit to the rule of our Savior, there would be no really hopeful prospect of a lasting peace among nations.»¹² Jesus Christ wants to reign because for this he came into the world. 13 This is what we must ask him during these days: «Reign, Lord, over every man and all human reality!» With this desire we want, here, «to offer him our persons for this work... and to distinguish ourselves in his service» 14 so that He might reign. 15 And we do this with complete confidence and with the courage that comes from the knowledge that it is He who calls everyone¹⁶ to «follow him in suffering, in order to rejoice later with Him in his victory.»¹⁷

With one voice, as one Family, both laity and consecrated, «we pledge all our strength to inculturate the Gospel, that is, to extend the Incarnation to all men, in the whole man, and in all of the manifestations of man.» These days should be a public testimony that only by reaffirming the urgent necessity of Jesus' Reign in today's world will man be able to find the way towards a hope that will no longer disappoint, and satisfy the emptiness and anguish left in his soul by the dramatic atheism of our time.

In a world deaf to the voice of Jesus, we want our profession to resound through all the earth, and so we must be united by the close bond which is Christ, made brothers and sisters in Him, both consecrated persons as well as tertiaries and lay friends of our Religious Family.

2- Second Goal: To Renew the Impulse of Lay Apostolate.

As a Religious Congregation we are truly «convinced that the sanctification of the laity is of immense value to the Church's life.»²⁰ From this conviction it follows that the Institute should «give priority to the formation of lay leaders»²¹ «so that they can direct temporal matters according to the plan of God.»²² If their proper temporal duties are neglected the evangelization of culture cannot be carried out. Fidelity to our specific purpose demands that we work together with our Third Order members and, in general, with all our friends who are convinced by the importance of the inculturation of the Gospel. This common effort cannot be optional for us, rather it is «an essential and constitutive part of the Institute... that cannot be overlooked, insofar as it is the prolongation of the Institute's actions in the proper spheres of the life of the laity.»²³

The laity, in turn, must not forget their apostolic vocation. The dogmatic Constitution Lumen Gentium refers to them in a notably strong text: «But the laity, by their very vocation, seek the kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and by ordering them according to the plan of God. They live in the world, that is, in each and in all of the secular professions and occupations. They live in the ordinary circumstances of family and social life, from which the very web of their existence is woven. They are called there by God that by exercising their proper function and led by the spirit of the Gospel they may work for the sanctification of the world from within (... and) in this way they may make Christ known to others, especially by the testimony of a life resplendent in faith, hope and charity. Therefore, since they are tightly bound up in all types of temporal affairs it is their special task to order and to throw light upon these affairs in such a way that they may come into being and then continually increase according to Christ to the praise of the Creator and the Redeemer.»²⁴


Saint Don Orione once said «today, whoever is not an apostle of Jesus Christ and the Church is an apostate.»²⁵ Therefore, we want these days to be a profound prayer and reflection about the laity's apostolic duty, keeping in mind that, now more than ever, «the laity must take up the renewal of the temporal order as their own special obligation. Led by the light of the Gospel and the mind of the Church and motivated by Christian charity, they must act directly and in a definite way in the temporal sphere.»²⁶

Our reflection and examination should not be reduced merely to the duty of apostolic activity, but also the «particular style of our apostolate.»²⁷ We must ask ourselves what it is that Christ and His Church expect of us in order to be faithful to what we are called to as members of this Religious Family. Though it is true that «there is nothing that is strictly new in our apostolate,»²⁸ but «we are unique in re-proposing existing apostolates which were originated in other congregations, like the Spiritual Exercises, oratories, popular missions, etc.»²⁹ However, we must not forget that «what we are unique for is the focalizing in the mystery of the Incarnation.»³⁰. This particular aspect is what we want to deepen our knowledge upon through the plenary conferences.



Faith is complete and perfect when we adore Jesus Christ hidden, veiled, and as it were, annihilated in the Sacred Host. It is the exercise of hope because Jesus Christ created the beautiful heaven of the Eucharist so that we could wait patiently for the Heaven of Glory and so that he could lead us to it. And it is the exercise of love, since love is the whole law, and we fulfill the whole law when, according to the first commandment, we adore our Lord and God with our whole mind, heart, soul and being. In adoration one can practice perfect charity toward one's neighbor by praying for him and acting as mediator and victim for his salvation, obtaining for him the Savior's graces and mercies. Eucharistic Adoration is the most just act: we adore Jesus Christ for all who do not adore Him, for all who forget Him, abandon Him, scorn Him, and offend Him.»³⁴



PRIESTS AVAILABLE FOR CONFESSION

We want all those who participate in this meeting to have the possibility of making a good confession, and, taking advantage of the large quantity of priests available, to be able to consult personally with them on spiritual matters. Our Constitutions tell us that the elevation of all human reality to the Gospel will be carried out through «priests, working as spiritual directors, enlightening the temporal order and forming lay people so that they can "direct temporal matters according to the plan of God." This is impossible without intimate and familiar dialogue with Jesus Christ, and this can always be improved through the direction of a priest.

THE MYSTERY OF THE INCARNATION AND THE CENTRALITY OF CHRIST IN THE DIVINE PLAN

While in ancient times, the attempts to deny the Incarnation were real although rather isolated, ³⁷ Saint John Paul II considers that our times are marked by such a denial. ³⁸ The close union between the human and the Divine made in the single Person of Jesus Christ is denied today in the continual attempt to separate God from man's reality, as if they were opposites. In this way, the supernatural world, on which human reality depends absolutely, stays «consigned to a distant past or a distant heaven» ³⁹ and, as much as some contemporaries say that they admire Jesus, «He remains distant.» ⁴⁰ Truly, considers the Great Pope, Jesus Christ is not known; nor is he loved or obeyed.

The rejection of the union between God and man brought about by the Incarnation brings «disturbing consequences.» We are witnesses of an indifferent culture of death, before which the prophetic words of Chesterton are confirmed: «take away the supernatural and what remains is the unnatural.»⁴¹ Fruits of such a denial are

abortion, euthanasia, and the deterioration of the family and sexuality. In addition to this, «when Christ is excluded or denied, our vision of human purpose dwindles; and as we anticipate and aim for less, hope gives way to despair, joy to depression.»⁴² Another disturbing consequence of denying the Incarnation is that «the individual relationship with God is seen as purely personal and private, so that God is removed from the processes that govern social, political and economic activity.»⁴³

We must not become accustomed to the culture of death, the destruction of the family, of the political societies disconnected from the Gospel. We must declare war on these realities, and for this it is necessary to raise the standard of the Incarnation of the Word. For only Christ can raise man, and all of man's reality, from the consequential misery brought on by the denial of His Mystery and of His reality as true God and true Man.

THE CHARISM OF THE INSTITUTE OF THE INCARNATE WORD

In raising up our small Religious Family of the Incarnate Word, God wants to reaffirm the Incarnation of the Word. The Holy Spirit grants a charism, a special grace received by the founder and ordained for the edification of the entire Church, in order that those who receive it may witness in their lives the virtues of Christ in the Incarnation: living ourselves the virtues of self-emptying, of transcendence, being essentially Marian as Christ was during His Incarnation. In this way, being «chalices full of Christ, chalices that allow the superabundance of His grace to overflow upon others, »44 we will be able to imbue other men and all of man's reality with Him. All our religious and, in a particular way according to their own condition, the laity of our Secular Third Order together with, all those who share in the urgent task of evangelizing culture are called to this charism, which is carried out first in the person himself in order to later offer it to others.

THE IMPORTANCE AND DIFFUSION OF THE IGNATIAN SPIRITUAL EXERCISES:

«The Institute will accomplish evangelization of the culture by sanctifying people individually. This will be done preferably by using the Spiritual Exercises according to the method and spirit of Saint Ignatius of Loyola.»⁴⁵

As means of personal sanctification, the Spiritual Exercises have a long-standing tradition in the Church's history which testifies to their superior effectiveness. This is why they are preferred to other methods. The Pontiffs themselves have expressed the importance of their promulgation: «In this manner, Venerable Brethren, may these Spiritual Exercises be extended everywhere through all the orders of Christian society and if they are diligently performed a spiritual regeneration will follow.

Piety will be enkindled, the forces of religious will be nourished, the apostolic office will unfold its fruit bearing branches, and peace will reign in society and in the hearts of all.»⁴⁶



This consideration of the importance and richness of the Spiritual Exercises «should bring us to deepen our knowledge of them, to prepare ourselves to enthusiastically promote them, to bring souls closer to this special fountain of God's grace that is the Spiritual Exercises.»⁴⁷

There are many lay persons who devote themselves to the propagation of the Exercises, organizing the practical aspects, inviting participants, finding and even constructing a place to preach them.

2.Youth

YOUTH AND THE EVANGELIZATION OF CULTURE

Our directory of the Secular Third Order emphasizes the importance of dedication to youth formation, in order to preserve the charism's vitality: «The words of this book will be dead words if we do not know how to form youth of great spirit who will transmit the charism to the new generations of our Religious Family.»⁴⁸

For this reason a reflection on youth apostolates which our Religious Family carries out, such as the Vocis Verbi, CIDEPROF, the "Crusaders of Jesus", Oratories, etc. is crucial. In this way, it will be possible to see how «to adapt the works and activities to the youth's environment and the cultural transformations which shake their world," so that our apostolates may be more effective in "personally getting to know the youth, to make them value what is good in them, to form their consciences and teach them how to make good use of their freedom, to encourage them with great ideals, to offer them the cross so that they may embrace it and thus live the true meaning of religion."

We will reflect concretely on how the youth, taking on the charism of our Congregation, can bear fruit by adopting the virtues of the Incarnation and translating them into specific apostolates for the Evangelization of culture.

THE FORMATION OF LAY LEADERS FOR THE SOCIAL KINGDOM OF CHRIST

This charism directly leads us to consider the need to have lay leaders who bring the social Kingdom of Christ into their temporal environment.

Man searches to live in society by nature. ⁵² «The social nature of man itself requires that he should give external expression to his internal acts of religion: that he should share with others in religious matters; that he should profess his religion in community. »⁵³ Religion cannot be a private act, without impacting society, ⁵⁴ and Jesus Christ is not only king of the internal sphere, but also of all creation.

That is why we must have truly Catholic laity who explicitly penetrate social reality with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. True leaders who, confronted with an increasingly hostile world, will need to fill themselves with valor for such a purpose, and to whom John Paul II directed his first words as Pontiff: «Do not be afraid. Open wide the doors for Christ, to his saving power. Open the boundaries of States, economic and political systems, the vast fields of culture, civilization and development. Do not be afraid.» Because after all, as Pope Leo XIII points out, the social question is «a problem whose acceptable solution would be truly void if it was not sought for under the support of religion and the Church.»⁵⁵

THE MISSION OF THE SECULAR THIRD ORDER

Sr. Mary Mother of Faith, SSVM

The challenges of effectively inculturating the Gospel today make the direct, explicit and communitarian work of the IVE lay tertiary necessary. This lay vocation allows them to enter certain temporal environments that can be difficult for a consecrated person: reaching «there where the priests and religious cannot go or enter, be it because their numbers are not sufficient to complete such obligations or be it because these are not suitable or worthy places of a consecrated person. In this way, redemption spreads also to the lowest or most hidden places.» ⁵⁶





And so, to achieve the evangelization of culture, we must count on the help from the laity: «It is an essential and constitutive part of the family of the "Incarnate Word." The Religious Family of the Incarnate Word cannot do without it, in so far as it prolongs the action of both Institutes in the

proper spheres of the life of the laity»⁵⁷

They must spiritually nourish themselves, in the light of the mystery of the Incarnation, in order to be able, with their lives and apostolates, to instill all their realities with the Gospel, like the family, political society, public education, work, etc. And it is not just a mere exterior identification with the mission of the religious priests and sisters, but the tertiaries of the IVE also live in communion of grace through the charism to which they are united, thus participating in the common spiritual goods of all the members of the Institute of the Incarnate Word.

Even though not all the participants of this meeting form part of our Third Order, this conference will be useful in order to better understand its essence, and as well as to orient them in their own Christian vocation as laity and in giving testimony to Christ in the world.

1.INTELLECTUAL AND CULTURAL APOSTOLATE:

To live the faith coherently and defend it, and to make the Gospel penetrate intellects and transform «thought patterns, standards of judgment and norms of behavior,»⁵⁸ it is necessary to undertake intellectual apostolates. For this reason it is of great importance to intensify the presence of the Church and the laity «in the privileged places of culture, that is, the world of education -school and university- in places of scientific and technological research, the areas of artistic creativity and work in the humanities.»⁵⁹

The inculturation of the Gospel, a specific purpose of our Religious Family, requires the capacity to distinguish that which is authentically human -insofar as it is redeemable-from that which is not, and «this work demands also on the part of responsible Christians a faith illumined by continual reflection confronted with the sources of the Church's message, and a continual spiritual discernment pursued in prayer.» 60



Therefore, there will be formative workshops about distinct disciplines (for example: philosophy, theology, social doctrine, art, sacred music, etc.). The main purpose of these workshops is to instruct, and also to encourage the laity to try to organize formative events themselves, such as: Catholic Culture Courses, publication or collaboration in formative journals, etc.



2. Cultural activities

As the «culture» which we are called to evangelize includes «artistic work, the art of man that transforms material things, converting them into beautiful things, »⁶¹ different expositions were developed with the goal of exemplifying the authentic human activity permeated by the Gospel.

Given that our goal is the evangelization of the culture insofar as it is a human reality, it would be certainly incomplete if it didn't include that highest human expression which is art.

Among the initiatives of the IVE Meeting, we will have, among other things, a «melodium» (explanation and analysis of a musical work), varied presentations by the Religious Family's choir, formative conferences about cultural growth and perfection and the exhibition of paintings in different rooms.

3. Pro-life and family apostolate

Through the union of the Divine Word with human nature, God has showed us "how lofty a place among creatures belonged to human nature, in that he appeared to men $[\ldots]$ as a true man, s^{62} since the Word is "consubstantial with the Father as to his divinity, and consubstantial to us as to his humanity."

For this reason the Third Order and our lay friends should commit themselves to the public promotion and defense of the dignity of the person and of all human life «from the moment of conception until his death.» It is our desire «that within this Third Order, laity and lay movements arise which defend man, attend to his needs and promote his worth. For example: charitable works on behalf of abandoned or disabled children, or children in any other type of need. **

It is also necessary to commit ourselves to defending of the original design of the family and sacramental marriage, making the love of God and Christian values reign in them, in order «to form strong and responsible characters, capable of making free and just choices, preparing their children for an openness to reality; thus forming a certain conception of life: the Christian and Catholic one. **





CONSECRATION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS THROUGH THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

In the year 2016, the entire Religious Family of the IncarnateWord was consecrated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The devotion to the Sacred Heart, «is an act of religion of high order; it demands of us a complete and unreserved determination to devote and consecrate ourselves to the love of the divine Redeemer, Whose wounded Heart is its living token and symbol.»⁷⁸



This particular form of worship is especially adequate to our spirituality, anchored in the mystery of the Incarnation of the Word, since it «rests on that principle whereby we recognize that His Heart, the noblest part of human nature, is hypostatically united to the Person of the Divine Word. Consequently, there must be paid to it that worship of adoration with which the Church honors the Person of the Incarnate Son of God Himself.»⁷⁹

For this reason, on the last day of the IVE Meeting, all the participants can make the Consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus through the Immaculate Heart of Mary with their own voice, asking these Hearts to deign to accept, bless and defend each one of us, together with our families, so that all that we are and all that we do might be a reparative consolation for all the offences that these Hearts receive.



After the Consecration, as a token of remembrance, a medal will be distributed to each participant.




